Highlights of our report include the following Accomplishment(s):

1. Most Notable Accomplishment

- Coordinated the John Lewis voter-cade for South DeKalb County to show support for Voting Rights.***
- Did a calling post with the Sixth District leadership for members to make calls to legislators to support the defeat of HB 202 the Voter suppression bill***
- Supported the William H. Graves NAACP Drive with phone calls, emails and the calling post to encourage members to join the NAACP.***
- Wrote a play for the Get out the Vote for the Connectional Lay Ministry Council performance that was on Zoom, Facebook and YouTube.***
- Raised over \$10,500.00 for the one in the spirit gala to assist churches in need.***
- Was re-elected the Chair of the African American Caucus of the DPG for the state of GA.***
- Coordinated and directed the Beautillion at Paine College entitled: "Young Lions"***
- Reported legislative updates regularly with contact numbers for a call to action.***

Our recommendations for the ensuing year include(s):

Encourage each local church in the region to have a social concerns chairperson that will work with the regional chairperson.

Monitor the membership to be sure each person is eligible to vote and that their name has not been purged from the roll.

Discuss with local members, parents and school board members your opposition to the bill banning critical race theory. Each state school board member has to have an annual meeting in the congressional district, make sure a meeting has or will take place in your district.

Educate members the importance of being vaccinated to include youth.

Share your county's mortgage and rent assistance with funds coming from the federal gov.

Encourage the governor to accept the \$300 per family from the federal gov. for needy families and not to reject it.
